

### **Statewide Employment**

- ★ 100,800 jobs lost in March 2020
  - o 11.7% of all jobs in NM
- ★ 26,500 jobs have come back as of February 2021
  - 26% recovery of jobs
- ★ Nationally 63% of jobs lost in March 2020 been have recovered








### Unemployment

★ Unemployment in New Mexico has not fallen as quickly as the national rate






### **Employment by Industry**



### **Personal Income & Stimulus Impact**

- ★ Personal Income without transfer payments is still below 2020 Q1
- ★ However, significant transfer payments have kept Personal Income rising
- ★ Does not mean this is true for everyone






- Unique dataset for New Mexico, provides business revenue data by location and industry
- Gathered through Gross Receipts Tax reporting
  - Important revenue source for state and local governments
- Available within 2-3 months



#### **Research Status**

- The Gross Receipts datasets provide a high frequency and highly detailed measure of business activity in New Mexico
- This data is difficult to analyze quickly, an interactive analysis tool would be useful for economic developers and policy makers
- Public Dashboard in development






Statewide Gross Receipts were up 20% year-over-year in Jan-Feb 2020




#### **New Mexico Gross Receipts YoY**

Accommodation And Food Services down significantly



#### Bernalillo Gross Receipts YoY








Eddy County impacted by lower Oil & Gas prices

#### **Eddy Gross Receipts YoY**




#### **Eddy Gross Receipts YoY**

#### Mckinley Gross Receipts YoY



#### **Conclusions**

- Impact of COVID-19 on New Mexico has been severe
- Impact varies greatly by industry and county
  - More research needed to understand what's driving this in specific cases
- Speed of recovery also varies greatly by industry
- Long-term or permanent damage may or may not exist
  - Economy was growing before pandemic
- Targeted efforts to address those most impacted should be considered
