



Eddy County New Mexico contracted Arrowhead Center at New Mexico State University to prepare a study of the impacts of Eddy County's petroleum industry on New Mexico from 2012-2018. The impact study considered the effect of Eddy County's petroleum industry on economic output, employment, and government revenues in New Mexico. The beneficiaries of these government revenues were estimated as well. Highlights of the study are summarized on this flyer.
