



Rachael Ryan is founder of Backyard Farms, a small farm situated in Vado, New Mexico. Recently, she received a New Mexico Small Business Innovation Research Matching Grant for \$25,000, and in May 2023, Backyard Farms secured \$43,000 from the

Hashem Aliedeh, Avicenna Diagnostics

Hashem has developed a cost-effective and innovative diabetes glucose meter with a permanent electrode system, specifically designed to address the needs of underserved populations. Supported by the Hunt Center, his journey includes business registration, patent application, securing non-profit support, and pursuing partnerships.

INNOVENTURE CHALLENGE







Successfully catering to more than 60 students. Innoventure's Winter Break Camp welcomed younger elementary school students who developed prototypes for holiday products, while older students created products pitched to a judging panel. Winners of the pitch competition had the opportunity to compete at the Innoventure Final Challenge.

The Crap Catcher 5.25 Thousand, created by Team Tech Gods from Hot Springs High School, is a 10ft wide circle net that individuals can throw from their water vessel. It features a cinch at the top to trap trash while enabling the escape of any caught fish, making it reusable and environmentally friendly by avoiding damage to the ocean floor caused by bottom trawling.

The Hydro Cleanser, developed by Team The 4.0's, is a machine placed under a bridge over a waterway, equipped with 10 screen doors that allow water to flow while capturing debris. It incorporates heat sensors that open the doors to let fish swim through before closing, while sweepers push collected trash into a waste bin, with the entire system powered by hydropower.

ACCESS TO CAPITAL





In a recent episode of ABC's "Shark Tank," Justin Crowe sought a \$400,000 investment and offered a 5% stake in his company, Parting Stone. Parting Stone, an AIF portfolio company, addresses the issue of receiving ashes after cremation by transforming them into polished stones. Crowe presented each shark with a stone containing portions of his grandfather's remains, sparking their interest. Despite some sharks declining, Lori Greiner and Kevin O'Leary offered the investment but asked for 20% equity. The exposure on Shark Tank was also beneficial, as Parting Stone aims to educate more people about their alternative option for dealing with cremated remains.



Electric Playhouse, an immersive entertainment venue based in Albuquerque and a portfolio company of AIF, is gearing up for an expansion into Las Vegas. Known for its interactive experiences that fuse technology, art, and play, Electric Playhouse plans to establish a substantial attraction in Las Vegas, integrating its distinctive features with the city's renowned entertainment ambiance. This strategic move aims to seize the opportunities presented by Las Vegas' thriving tourism and entertainment market. The company has set a target to open the new location in the summer of 2023.

FIRE VENTURE FELLOWS

The FIRE Fellows Venture Fellowship is a highly selective program that aims to train university students in the Borderplex region in venture capital, with the ultimate goal of fostering growth and development within the regional startup ecosystem.

The spring 2023 class comprises a group of twelve students, with six from NMSU and six from UTEP. These students represent a wide range of academic disciplines, including accounting, finance, computer science, and marketing. They bring with them diverse internship experiences, varying levels of education, and a multitude of career interests.
